arrival in 1912.

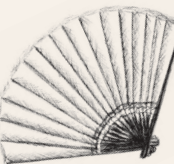
4. LORD LYMINGTON

not as it seemed.



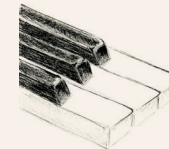
5. THE YOUNG URCHIN
